

Instructions for Authors at the 33rd IARIW General Conference, Rotterdam, the Netherlands, August 24-30, 2014

The preliminary conference program is posted at <http://www.iariw.org/c2014netherlands.php>.

Papers presented at IARIW conferences are made available on the conference website to conference participants before the event, both to provide discussants ample time to prepare their remarks and to give delegates an opportunity to read the papers before presentation. Consequently, a completed paper must be sent to the IARIW secretariat at info@iariw.org by July 31, 2014. This requirement also applies to papers in the poster session. This is a firm deadline and failure to respect it can result in removal of the paper from the program. Please note that it is IARIW tradition at General Conferences for the discussant to both present and discuss the paper. The author is given time to respond.

Statistics Netherlands is responsible for the local arrangements for the conference. The conference website, which includes information on registration procedures and accommodation and meal arrangements, is posted at <http://www.cbs-events.nl/iariw/home/>. All authors attending the conference must register.

The IARIW has a registration fee for non-members that is included in the package price. This fee is not paid by individual IARIW members and individuals employed by IARIW institutional members (a list of institutional members is posted at www.iariw.org/members.php). Individuals who are not members are strongly encouraged to join the IARIW to obtain the benefits of membership, including a subscription to the *Review of Income and Wealth*, and to avoid the IARIW conference registration fee. The Nancy and Richard Ruggles Memorial Fund provides for a prize to promote the development of young researchers by recognizing their outstanding scholarship. One prize will be awarded competitively on the basis of a paper presented at the 2014 IARIW General Conference, as judged by the Trustees of the Fund. Papers can be by a single author or multiple authors, all of whom must be equal to or less than 35 years of age on February 15, 2014 to be eligible.
