The opening session on sustainability, growth and well-being, with presentations by Walter Radermacher, Director General of Eurostat, and Marcel Fratzscher, President of DIW Berlin, was particularly stimulating.

#### **New IARIW President**

He will assume the presidency in August 2018.

## **2018 General Conference**
