Charlotte Bartels is a Research Associate at the German Institute for Economic Research (DIW). During the past few years she was also an interim professor in microeconomics in the Faculty of Economics at Ludwig Maximilian University of Munich (2023/24), a Kennedy fellow at the Center for European Studies at Harvard University (2021/22), and a Visiting Associate Professor at the City University New York (CUNY). Her research interests lie in the fields of public economics, labor economics and economic history, in particular the distribution and redistribution of economic resources, the underlying mechanisms behind changes in the distribution of income and wealth, and how taxation affects labor market and investment behaviour. She has also worked on the distributional national accounts for Germany. She is affiliated with CEPR (Public Economics, Economic History), IZA, CESifo, the Uppsala Center for Fiscal Studies (UCFS) and EU Tax Observatory and a member of Die Junge Akademie. She is an assistant editor of the Journal of Income Distribution and her research has been published in the Review of Income and Wealth, Journal of Economic Inequality, Economic Journal, Economic Letters, International Tax and Public Finance, and the Review of Economics and Statistics, among others. She regularly attends the ECINEQ conferences and is a fellow of the World Inequality Database. She received her PhD (Dr. rer. pol.) in Economics from Freie Universität Berlin.
